



Declassified E.O. 12958 Complete copy of an "Unknown" or "X" file digitized from the original held at the Washington National Records Center, Suitland, MD. NARRAT IVE ON HURTGEN, GERMANY CASE. On 9 April 1947 we proceeded to the Hurtgen-Forest, District # 88, to disinter the remains of an American deceased found by forester LUDWIG PFAFFE, Germeter # 9. LUDWIG PRAFFE found the remains on his regular course as a forester in this district. The remains consist of dry bones remaining G.I. equipment. The deceased was recovered near a German Mine-Belt, leading through this area. Wild animals had access to the remains. No I.D.-tags or other means of identification could be found on the remains. 







- 1. Our Front Lines; Overlay.
- 2. Location of Proops: Overlay.
- 5. Information of Adjacent Units and Supporting Troops: Overlay. The 44th Field Artillery Battelion, reinforced by the 20th Field Artillery Battelion; and Company "C" 4th Engineer (C) Battelion (less one plateen) remained in direct support of Combat Team:continuing with their usual support.
- 4. Weather and visibility: Partly cloudy with occasional rein. Temperatures were moderately cold and visibility good.
- 5. Our operations for the period;

a. Infantry: meny artillery and mortar fire continued in moderate intensity throughout the night 24-25 November.

The plan for 25 November was an attack by the 3rd and Enttalians. The former was to envelop GROSSHAU to the north and take the town from that direction. The latter was to reach the edge of the woods southwest of the town where direct fire could be placed on GROSSHAU and KLEINHAU. The attack was to be made at an early hour without an artillery preparation, in the hope of surprising the enemy.

The 3rd Battalion attacked at 0745 hours. The attack of the 2nd Battalion, delayed by the inability of their armor to negotiate the poor roads available, jumped off without tanks at 0820 hours. Both battalions moved forward slowly despite elmost immediate resistance from small arms, morter, and artillory fire.

By 0845 hours the 3rd Battelion was north of GROSSHAU (coordinates 048385). Fifty (50) prisoners were taken in this area and the bettalion paused to reorganize before pushing south to the town. The delay was protracted when difficulties were not in moving tanks and tank destroyers to the forward elements. Enemy artillery and mortar fire increased and serious casualties were sustained.

The 2nd pattalion continued their advance which was bitterly contested by the enemy, and at 1050 hours the leading elements of the unit were on their objectivenear the edge of the woods southwest of GROSSHAU.

At 1145 hours the 3rd Battelion, supported by tanks and tank destroyers, attacked to the south across the open fields north of GROSSBAU. The enemy reaction from the town was immediate and powerful. Enemy self-propelled guns, mortar, and small arms fire stopped the attack, disabling four (4) tanks end two (3) tank destroyers. Further attempts to reach the town from the north were repulsed; and at 1500 hours the 3rd Battelion dug in north of the town. Gasualties were heavy from enemy mortar and artillery fire.

The let Battalion, in reserve, moved to the east following the attack of the 3rd Battalion. One company, astride the east—west road to GROSSBAU, had the mission of clearing the area north of the 2nd Battalion as far as the edge of town.




Geospatial Information System (GIS) layering of:

- 3. 12th Infantry Regiment overlay from 9 Nov 1944


DPAA battle analysis map based upon unit records, personnel files, and combat overlays



Each red dot represents the approximate last known location of a missing American




Each yellow dot represents the approximate recovery location of an unidentified body



Comparison of loss locations with recovery locations of unidentified remains



DPAA Identifications of Hürtgen Forest casualties since 2016


= Last known location of still-missing soldier




Comparison of loss locations with recovery locations of unidentified remains
